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OUR Learning

We have been working hard over the last few months! We have focused on letters and the sounds that they make, and have learned all consonant and most vowel sounds! We will continue working on our this very important skill, as well as understanding how to use letters and words to make messages, and exploring how messages can convey meaning beyond just words: interpreting motivations, illustrations, and sequencing events in messages. We will also be incorporating more opportunities to practice our developing printing skills! We have been working on subitizing, one-toone correspondence and simple addition/counting on. We will have a lot of opportunity to practice forward and backward counting with our countdown to Christmas. Advent is an incredibly important time in the Catholic Faith, and we will be exploring this by reading the Bible, participating in our daily Advent celebrations, and discussing what Christmas means to us!

Please ensure that your child is dressed for the weather every day! Though we are still experiencing a bit of warm weather, we will soon consistently be in the negatives! Safe and kind Playgrounds

Prior to the fall break, our school community has been working on ways that we can play safely and kindly with one another (including those in other grades), especially at recess and on the playground. Monday and Thursday students participated in a safe play workshop with our Mental Health Capacity Builder, Emma and Mme Gravelle-this focused on personal space awareness and safety on the playground. Please discuss this with your child and encourage them to play safely and kindly at recess.

As a school staff, we are continuing to experiment with playground access and scheduling, as well as creating classroom pairings for reading buddies to build relationship across grade levels.

We can encourage our students/children to show kindness and empathy on the playground by not only modelling, but explaining to children why we are taking the actions we are: "your sister is crying because she is scared, I'm giving her hugs to help her feel better" or "we are going to call grandpa tonight because it always makes him happy to hear from us."
