PARENTS & VOLUNTEERS

VISITORS /CLASS VOLUNTEERS Protocols

COMMUNICATION

Please communicate with your child's teacher through the mode of communication they establish. Your child's teacher is your primary contact. Your teacher will send home Newsletters and messaging to you about programing, events and issues. Administration. will send home electronic newsletter weekly. Any hard copy notes will go home in your child's Agenda. PLEASE USE YOUR CHILD'S AGENDA to communicate how your child will go home if it has changed from the regular routine.

EARLY LEARNING PROGRAMING

We have Three Early Learning Programs. Brighter Beginnings: is an intensive Early Intervention Program specifically tailored to meet the individual needs of each child between the ages of 2 1/2 to 5 1/2 years who may have a moderate and/or severe delay in one or more developmental areas, such as speech and language, fine and gross motor, or a medical condition. Brighter Beginnings offers a rich literacy, communication and numeracy experience for children with loving, experienced educators and consultants

Pre-Kindergarten:Pre-Kindergarten classes are taught by knowledgeable and caring certified teacher with the support of a multidisciplinary team.

As part of a well-rounded, learning through play curriculum, children:

- -build relationships with peers, teachers and school community.
- develop independence and confidence
- experience dramatic and imaginative play -explore early literacy and numeracy concepts and expand their language and communication skills.

Kindergarten: Kindergarten programming helps develop independence, initiative, decision making, creativity, confidence and the ability to learn, relationships and feelings of self-worth. Each child is unique and, together with parents as our partners, we build upon children's natural curiosity and spontaneity, encouraging and supporting them as they take their first step into school.

LITERACY AND NUMERACY

Our teachers are highly trained in Literacy and Numeracy, and we continually revisit programming and instruction to ensure your child is learning at optimum. Guided Reading is scheduled into the calendar daily. We stress the use of manipulatives to optimize numeracy instruction. We encourage parents to read with their children regularly and play math games whenever possible.

We offer **FLEX** programing on many Friday afternoons. FLEX programing is highly engaging. It is liken unto an option class. Some of the classes have been: Break out Boxes, Ukrainian Dancing, Owling, Crafts and Cooking, Coding with Dot and Dash,

Leadership, STEM Parachutes and Fairy Tales, Active Play, Painting, Sewing, Art & Science experiments etc. Parents need to sign up their child for the program they wish for them to attend. A letter will go home with details of the programing and when the sign up is open. Register right away as sessions fill up quickly. <u>School Council pays for all FLEX programing</u>.

ENHANCED PROGRAMING

Fees will be charged for field trips, enhanced programming and cultural activities. Fees will be put directly on to your Powerschool account. Parents have a choice to opt out of the trip or program. Please speak to your child's teacher.

DISCIPLINE WITH DIGNITY

At Madonna Catholic School, maintaining the dignity of each person, in all situations, is crucial in managing behavior. Effective discipline comes from the belief that teaching individuals to take responsibility for their behavior is more motivating in creating behavioural changes than teaching individuals to be obedient in order to avoid punishment.

We believe in the responsibility model of discipline. By implementing appropriate and progressing consequences, and by providing individuals with opportunities to become responsible and caring members of the community, they will learn about their behaviours, their choices, and their impact on others while still maintaining their dignity. Discipline matters will be handled on a case by case basis.

We Utilize Sharing Circles to ensure that everyone has a voice when problem solving.

Our GOAL is to continue to build a faith filled safe and caring culture within our school community, where students, staff, and parents encourage, value, support one another, and feel safe; and where abuse, bullying, and discrimination are **unacceptable.**

Bullying is:

- When a person is the target, <u>over time</u>, of repeated negative actions.
- When one person has more power, so the

- person being victimized feels that they can't defend him/herself.
- When a person, who is the target, may feel embarrassed, hurt, scared, and/or angry.
