#### OUR LEARNING

### DROP-OFF & PICK-UP

- If your child arrives late to school, please accompany them to the front door and ring the bell. Our office staff will let you in.
- Please note that kindergarten students must be accompanied by an adult during drop off and pick up. Guardians are expected to stay with their child at the pink dots until a staff member is present (8:30am) and should meet us on the pink dots at pick-up (3:13pm). Kindergarten students are not permitted to walk alone to guardian's vehicles. Students on the bus will be accompanied by a staff member to and from the bus on the school side, and guardians are expected to bring children to and from their bus stop on the home side.
- If pick-up arrangements for your child must be changed, please let our office know **(by phone call)** by 2:30pm.

#### CLass communication

This year we will be using email and Class Dojo as our main forms of classroom communication. We will use email to send our monthly newsletter, provide field trip information, and anything especially pressing. Class Dojo provides a great platform for sharing photos of student work and classroom activities, as well as casual reminders of upcoming activities.

Class Dojo will also be a spot for me to periodically request parent helpif anyone is interested in helping cut/trace/prep craft activities for me, it would be greatly appreciated!

Many students use these throughout their career at Madonna-students in grade 1-4 often use them to hold their agendas. If your child has a Kanga Pouch from an older sibling, please ensure to send this to school this Tuesday and Wednesday. Thank you!

We will be diligently working on our art over the next few weeks and in October, we will be taking a field trip to the library to see our art, as well as tour the library. #### Family Photos

We will be learning about ourselves and each other over the next month-we would love if each child could share a photo of their family with the class, which will then be hung up around our "family" board. This is also helpful for students missing home-having a photo of their family available can help to reassure! Please share a photo of your family with Mrs. Fortier via email or sending in your child's kanga pouch.

#### Letter Formation and Grasp

Your child's kindergarten year is a wonderful time for your child to learn through **doing:** exploring different sensory materials, using a variety of tools, and taking part in gross motor play to build hand, arm, and shoulder strength-all these experiences will help your child to become a better writer!

If your child is starting to enjoy and explore coloring and writing at home, take a moment to encourage proper grasp and letter formation (if applicable).

A <u>mature grasp</u> allows for more efficient and precise printing-which is important in later school years when students need to write more, faster. The best way to facilitate a "pinch grasp" is to use broken crayons! <u>Letter formation</u> is also important, and starting top->bottom, left->right will not only help students write quicker and more legibly, but also helps students internalize the shapes of letters leading to better letter-sound connections, which can facilitate future reading development.
